PLANEX is a bibliographic database which offers a unique collection of quality resources on the property market and development.

It is produced in the UK and its content, abstracts and terminology are tailored to the interests of the UK's academic community.

PLANEX can help you keep up to date with the latest developments in this subject area and provides resources to support research and coursework.

Our property coverage includes: affordable housing; social housing; lettings; property management; property market;

development plans; town and country planning; retail property; residential property; infrastructure; design guidance; housing supply and need; land and sites; energy efficiency; conservation; heritage; listed buildings; asset management and smart cities.

We also cover related topics, including sustainable development, climate change adaptation and mitigation, urban regeneration and economic development.

The database has limited full text access to journal articles and links to your university's subscription content via link resolvers. It also provides quick and easy access to online research reports via links.

Abstracts include the headline findings from research and recommendations for policy and practice, making it easier for you to identify material which is relevant to your research question.



How to access PLANEX

Students and staff can access PLANEX via the library resources page or direct by following the link on this page <http://informationsservice.idoxgroup.com> and selecting 'Log in via your home institution', which allows you to select your university and log in using your institutional login.

The first time you login, you will be prompted to fill in a registration form with your name, email address and course/department, and you will then be sent a validation email to allow you to start using the database.
